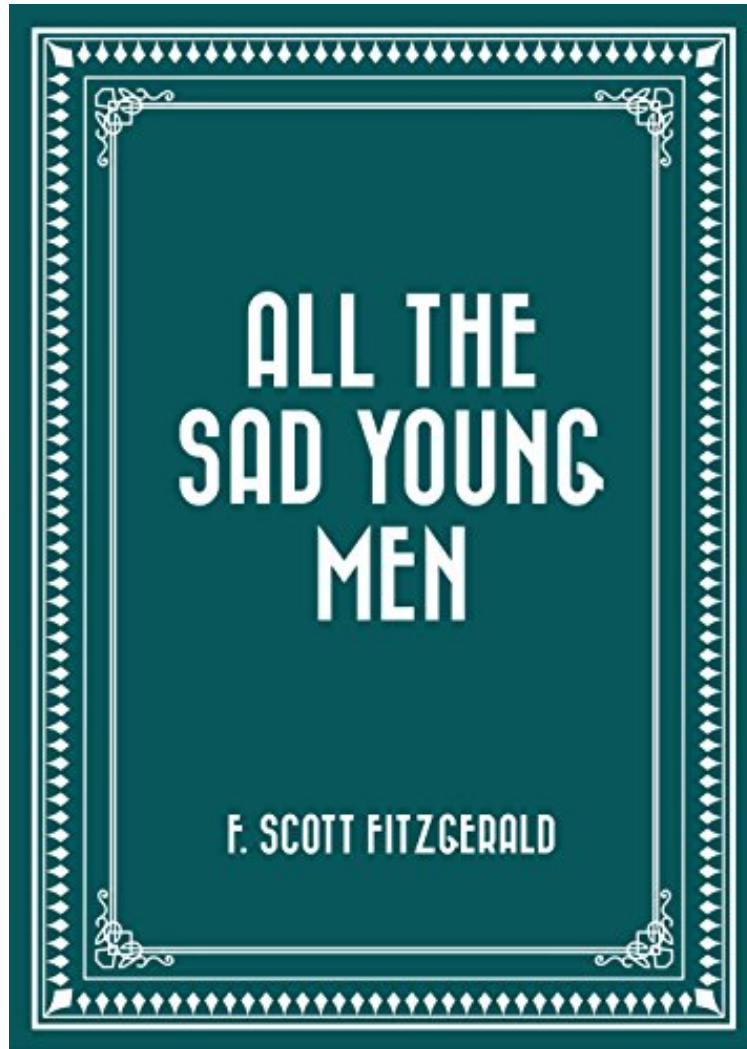

He finished four novels: *This Side of Paradise*, *The Beautiful and Damned*, *The Great Gatsby* (his best known), and *Tender Is the Night*. A fifth, unfinished novel, *The Love of the Last Tycoon*, was published posthumously. Fitzgerald also wrote numerous short stories, many of which treat themes of youth and promise, and age and despair.
