It has more action and suspense than the first book, but less of the wry humor that made the first book so irresistible. Mug and Donchen are still active and present, and we see a great

new character in the no-nonsense penswift Mrs Primsbite, but unfortunately much less of the Bellringers and almost nothing (after the beginning) of Shingvere and Fromarch. Also none of the hints about a conspiracy from the end of the first book are taken up in this one. The biggest change, however, is in Meralda. I was surprised that she apparently has no curiosity whatsoever to visit the Hang lands and possibly learn about their magic, but only moons like a love-struck teenager about the separation from Donchen. As the story unfolds her thoughts and comments turn from ironic to bleak, which is understandable considering the changes she experiences, but made me feel bleak as well, while the first book had improved my mood.
