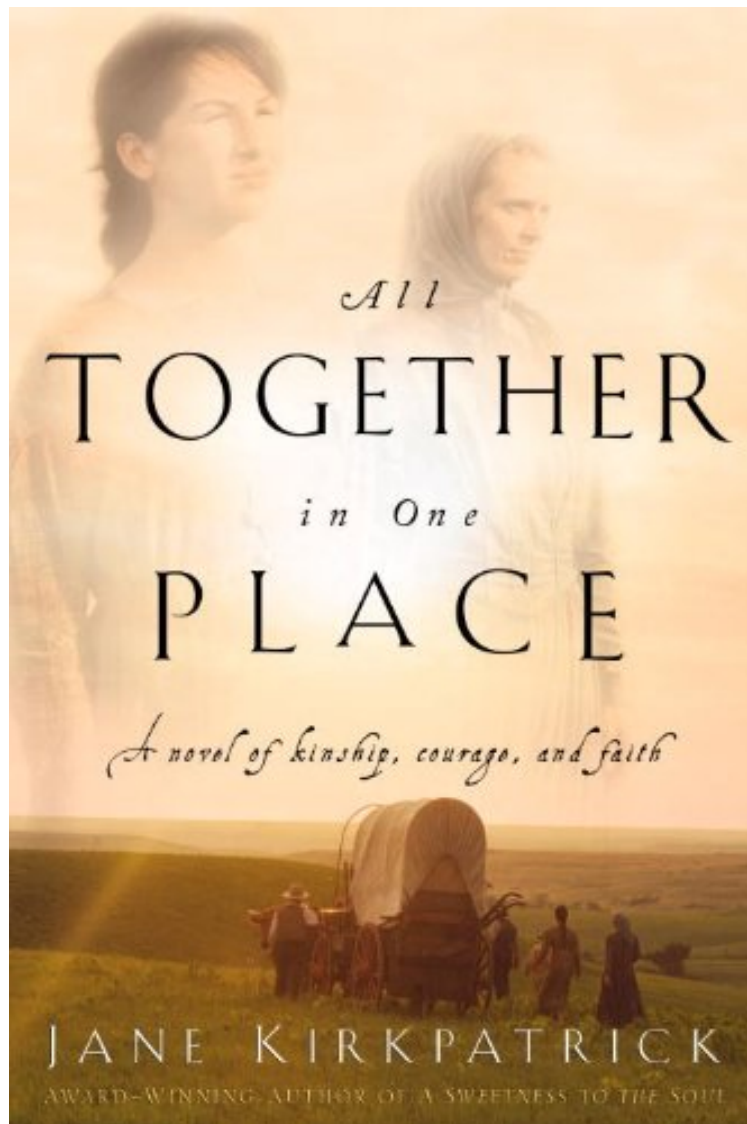

Unfortunately, though, Kirkpatrick (*A Burden Shared*) leaves several plot points hanging while she wraps others up a little too easily.
