Rendell does a masterful job here of layering new elements to the mystery with

every concluding chapter and the outcome eventually turns out to be surprising yet sensible. Rendell is also an expert at molding three dimensional characters with only minimal details (what was the other reviewer reading? ). Not as bleak as her other books, but nowhere near as convincing either.
