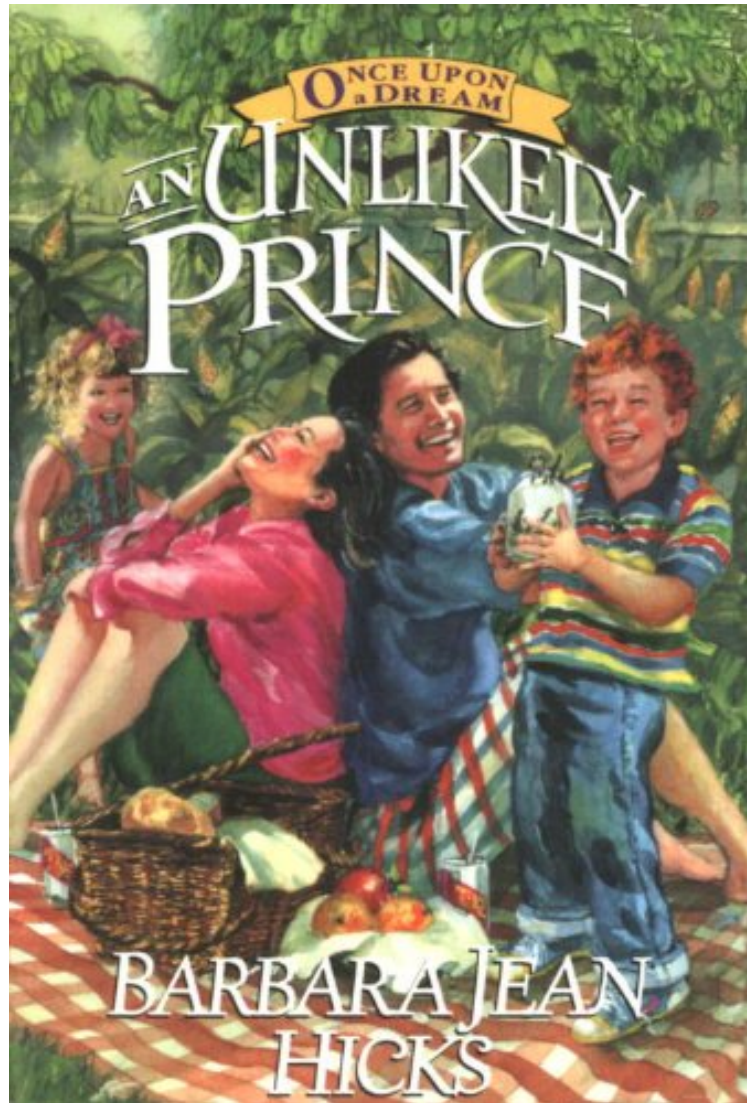

Dear Reader: I probably had more fun writing this book than I've ever had writing anything! An Unlikely Prince began life as Suzie and the Seven Imps, with Suzie Wyatt playing the part of Snow White and the seven adorable but not always perfectly-behaved darlings enrolled in her KinderKottage preschool and daycare center corresponding to Snow Whites seven dwarves. (Theres Donovan, for instance, who has allergies and is constantly sneezing, and little Heidi, whos so bashful she actually makes it through the entire story without saying a single word.) I needed a witch, of course, so crotchety old Olga Pfefferkuchen, Suzies next door neighbor, sprang to life. Her goal? Putting KinderKottage out of business. As for Suzies fairy-tale prince. . . Well, as one reviewer put it, a more unlikely prince you are not likely to meet in the pages of romance. Harrison Hunt is a severely buttoned-down history professor who dislikes children intensely (unfortunate, as the house hes leased for a year is right next door to KinderKottage); who is so unsettled around the feminine gender that hes actually developed a personalized Method for Dealing with Desirable Women--the Less Dangerous Category method, he calls it; and whose confidante is a Siamese fighting fish named Blue! Poor Harrison--or is it lucky Harrison? With Suzie and her seven imps next door, life will never be the same. Heres a short excerpt--Harrison employing his Method when he first meets his new landlady, who is also Suzies friend, sister-in-law, and business partner, Priscilla: Dr. Hunt? A pretty redhead appeared around the corner of the house. Oh! As usual when confronted by a pretty woman, Harrison felt flustered. Befuddled. Thoroughly unsettled. It was a handicap hed dealt with all his life, feeling self-conscious in the presence of pretty women. It might have been a debilitating handicap, considering that females--many of whom could be considered pleasing to the eye--made up roughly half the population. And appeared with quite provoking regularity in faculty meetings and classrooms, not to mention libraries, banks, doctors offices, restaurants, stores, et cetera ad infinitum. Harrisons Method for Dealing with Desirable Women was almost automatic by now. The Less Dangerous Category method, it might be called. The moment a pretty woman hove into view, his brain started clicking through the categorical possibilities: Colleague. Student. Service Provider. Salesperson. Anything but Pretty Woman. Property Manager, he settled on for the redhead without too much fuss and flurry. He shifted Blues jar in his arms and reached to shake her hand. Mrs. Wyatt. How do you do? As you might guess, Harrisons Method fails him completely when he first meets Suzie. Maybe its because shes an exceptionally pretty woman. Or maybe its because when he first meets Suzie, shes racing through his house. Chasing a dog and a red-headed kid who's right off the cover of MAD magazine. On top of which, she's barking!
