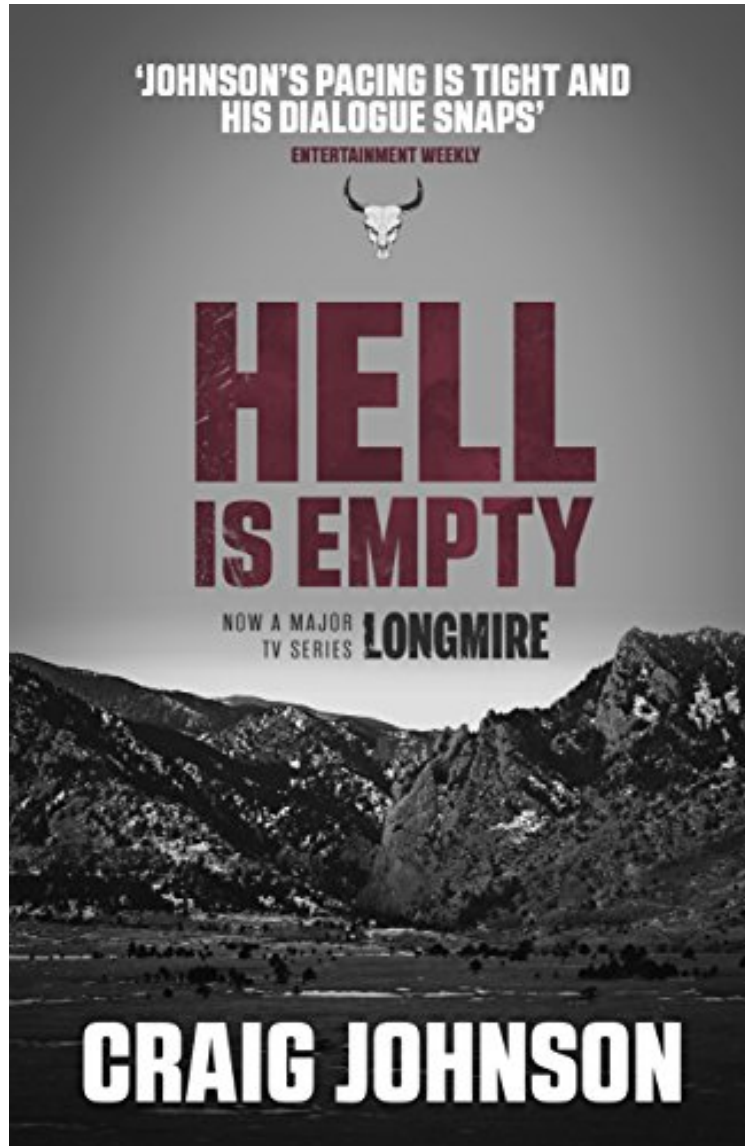

Deshalb gibt es neben dem Polizeiteam von Longmire, welches auerhalb der Reservation zustndig ist, eine Reservatspolizei. Johnson hat mit der Nhe zum Reservat die Chance ergriffen, ber das heutige Leben der Indianer zu berichten und darber hinaus alle polizeilichen Ermittlungen etwas mystisch anzuhauchen. Der hier besprochene Roman erschien 2011 innerhalb der Walt Longmire Mysteries-Reihe, in welcher Longmire der Chefermittler ist. Jeder Roman kann ruhigen Gewissens fr sich alleine gelesen werden. Bei "Hell is empty" geht es zunchst darum, dass Raynaud Shade, ein adoptierter Crow Indianer gerade gestanden hat, vor zwanzig Jahren einen Jungen ermordet und in den Bighorn-Bergen verscharrt zu haben. Die Leiche soll im Amtsbereich von Longmire liegen. Bei einem Gefangenentransport von Shade und einiger weiterer Mrder, der durch das Reservat fhren soll und auerdem vom FBI begleitet wird, brechen die Gefangenen aus. Dabei nehmen sie Geiseln mit. Von nun an beginnt eine Hetzjagd in Schnee und Klte durch das Gebirge. Der Rdelsfhrer der Gefangenen hebt sich durch besondere Brutalitt hervor. Longmire jagt dem Gangster lange Zeit alleine hinterher, leere Akkus kappen immer wieder die Kommunikation mit seinen Leuten und dem Freund Henry Standing Bear, einem Cheyenne. Gefhrt wird Longmire lediglich von der indianischen Mystik und einem Taschenbuch des Romans "Dante's Inferno". Longmires Abneigung gegenber Smartphones macht ihn besonders sympathisch. Da begegnet ihm ein alter Indianer. Zufllig ist es der Grovater des Opfers, weshalb der brutale Ganove festgesetzt wurde. Ist diese Begegnung wirklich Zufall? Der Indianer hilft dem verletzten Sheriff. Doch der fragt sich immer wieder, ob er vielleicht wegen seiner geschwundenen Krfte in der Eisesklte halluziniert. Denn der Indianer verschwindet immer wieder so pltzlich wie er kommt. Obwohl er stets verspricht, an seiner Position zu bleiben.
