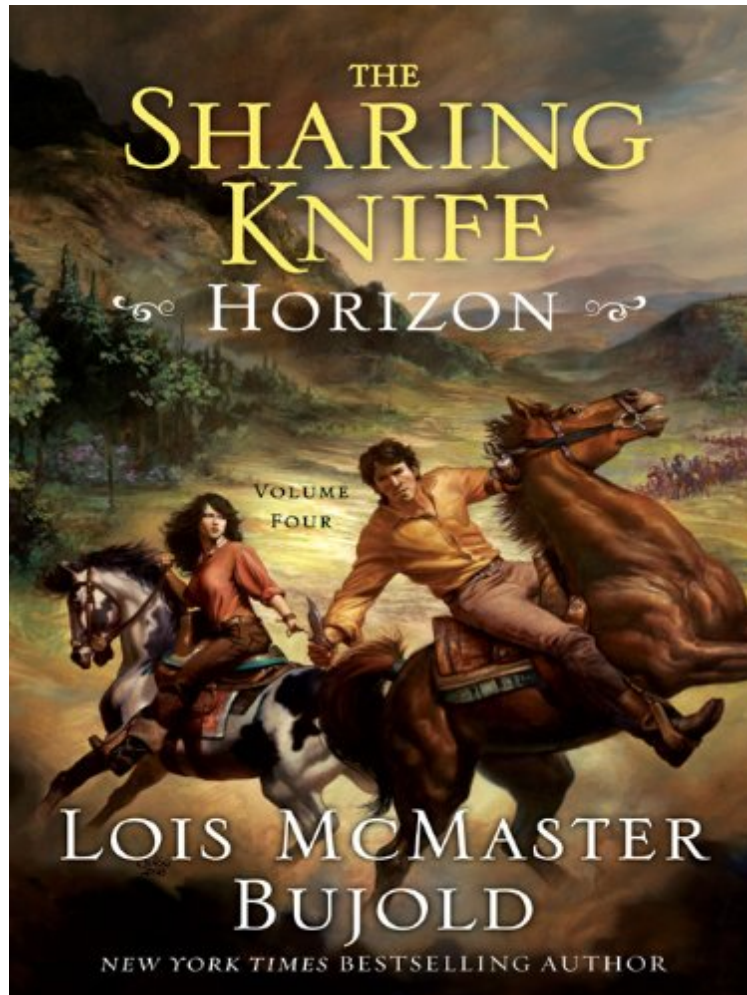

There is plenty of travelling and meeting odd people in odd places, as required in fantasy novels. Though her heroes are often threatened or injured, there's no real trauma about it. They all seem to be nice people, and the nasty people they meet die tidily and mostly off-stage. The heroine seems to be out of a Mills and Boone romance, she sticks to her man whatever he does and wherever he goes, without any input from her. She is redeemed by killing the odd monster that crosses her path, and doing other heroic deeds, in a quite level-headed manner. I would have given 5 stars if the heoine had been less wet. Anyway, I read the whole series in one go and loved them.
