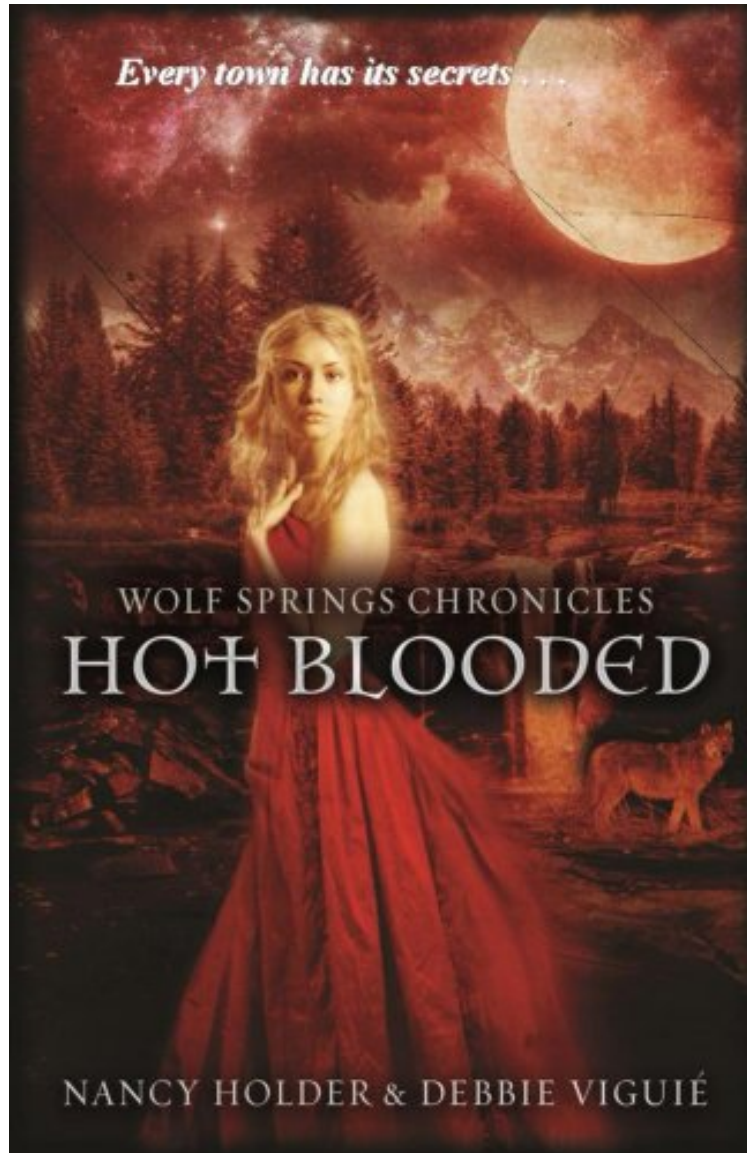


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Hot Blooded (Wolf Springs Chronicles Book 2) (English Edition)

No way to talk and review book two

without spoiling events in book one. Synopsis [by Goodreads.com] Wolf Springs was just going to be a short stop for Katelyn McBride--until she turned 18 and could return to LA on her own. But Katelyn's plans have unraveled. Katelyn wasn't in Wolf Springs a month when she was attacked by a werewolf. And now she carries that creature's curse in her veins. But she's not alone. Wolf Springs is home to werewolves. And they swear that it wasn't any of them who bit her. Changing humans without permission means the death penalty, and they're none too happy about Katelyn. The only explanation is that there's a monster on the loose--something wild and uncontrollable. Because Katelyn has some of its power. And two guys want Katelyn: one dark and mysterious, yet perhaps the perfect confidant; the other ferocious and forbidden--a werewolf that she can't keep her hands off of. Review Book two starts directly where book one, "Unleashed", ended: Kat is a werewolf, her friend and "co-werewolf" Cordelia is banished from the pack and she has to come to grips now with starting life as a moon-driven monster at the bottom of the pack. There are more complications, since she lives with her grandfather in his cabin in the woods, who must never know about werewolves or he and Kat will get killed. The same goes for her friendship/relationship with Trick, that she has to put on hold more than once, because if she ever hurt him and drew blood in the process, he would be cursed as well. For quite a huge part of the book, Kat's life and her outlook on the future are rather miserable: she is hated by the Fenner-pack, they mistrust her and they treat her as the lowest of the low. Not having been born a werewolf, none of the pack-hierarchy rules make sense to her [neither do they to me, by the way] and the control the alpha has of her and her life are chafing her. And this was the part, I could really commiserate with. But as with book one, I could so not stand the pseudo-love[lust]-triangle. Justin, the alpha's nephew [who has the werewolf-equivalent of a fiance], is such a douche... wow! Besides having a girlfriend, he makes Kat call him "sir". And instead of being annoyed [and worse], Kat muses about his hotness. Ahem.... What?!? This is a general trait in Kat's personality and I truly dislike it: people mistreat her [be it Justin, Cordelia, Trick, whomever] and she thinks it totally ok. Indeed, there are not many people in Kat's proximity who behave consistently decent. And that would enhance the bleakness of Kat's situation and could be a good premise, but the way she lets people mistreat her again and again, just annoys me. Back to the "love"-triangle: besides "sir" Justin, there is still Trick and although he has all the source material to be a decent, yet cool guy, I don't feel it. I mean, we are told, what they feel for each other and why. And the explanations are pretty good, but the action to back up the talk was missing. I read love, I don't experience it. The story itself is mostly about Kat getting some werewolf-training, learning more about her parents and still people getting mauled and killed or lost in the woods. It leads to the presumed showdown/culmination that I expect to happen in part three, "Savage", so it was a "middle book": it helped lay the ground for the final, but did not really have its own story. Oh and concerning the end: it's a cliffhanger of the worst kind. Since I still want to see, if Kat finally gets a grip and mans up, I will continue the "Wolf Creek Chronicles" and the severe end doesn't bother me. But it should be mentioned. So I will now read "Savage" and hope that some people get what they deserve and Kat realizes what adequate reactions to mistreatment are...
