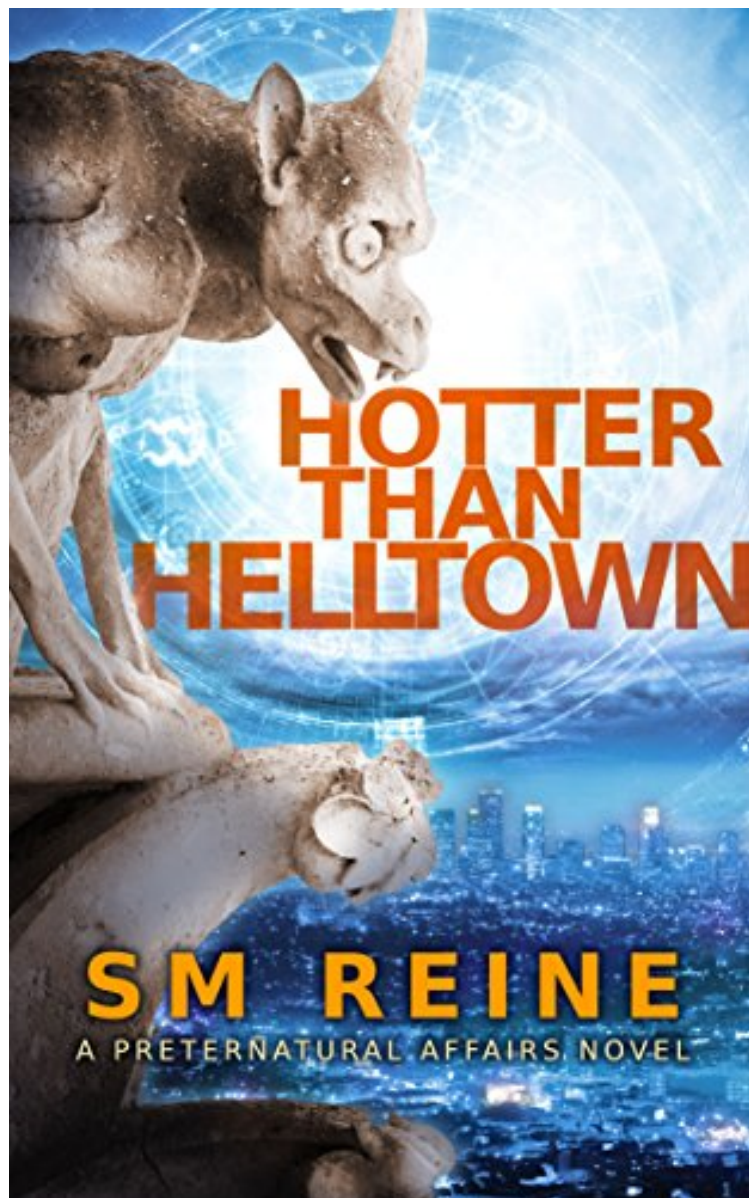

Von Gerd Drner Paranormal Affairs is a series written in TV style, with an opening/teaser chapter followed by Csar giving us his I work for the Office of Paranormal Affairs speech. I really like that about it. Hotter than Helltown feels well thought out, carefully developed and needs no knowledge of Saras other writings. It does pick up a left over from episode two, Lucrezia de Angeliss ultimatum that Csar has to magically bond to his boss Fritz Friederling, but you get the gist of what went before reading this as a standalone. Think of it as entering into CSI in the middle of Season one, you wont get all the finer Character development, but youll be able to follow the case and can drop in and out without needing to go back to a former episode or to watch the follow ups. Which brings me to a further point where "Hotter than Helltown" met my expectations: This is an episode in the new series, which I feel comfortable to recommend to new readers. Im still not a big fan of Agent Csar Hawke to be honest, but he does have his fun moments, like when hes allowed to give some typical Reine joke, poking fun at the archetypical macho hero: He might have been my boss, but I still couldnt help but give him a Look. The kind of Look that said, Youre a billionaire with a passion for silent movies and aggressive stock investments, yet you listen to jock jams in the car? He gave me a responding Look that was like, Dont forget that I gave you this job and saved your life. I can listen to whatever I want. And my Look was conciliatory, because he was right. Kind of a dick move to go all judgmental on someone whod done as much for me as Fritz had. We have really meaningful Looks. He also has a brilliant, in the best sense gay scene when his boss Fritz makes him a present, at a murder scene no less, where he gets to both show his feminine side and play up his fear of being thought a softie by directly afterward reassuring us of what a manly man he is. His deep down honesty, I feel the way Sara is making fun of the alpha heroes commonly found in UF/PR through Csar is one of the constant highlights. But then he will sometimes show his prejudiced side, and turn into a real dickhead; a horny dickhead whenever Isobel Stonecrow is around, who not only leads him on but spends most of the story dressed like an escapee from a seventies sleaze movie. Still, an easy recommendation for fans of Paranormal TV-Shows.
