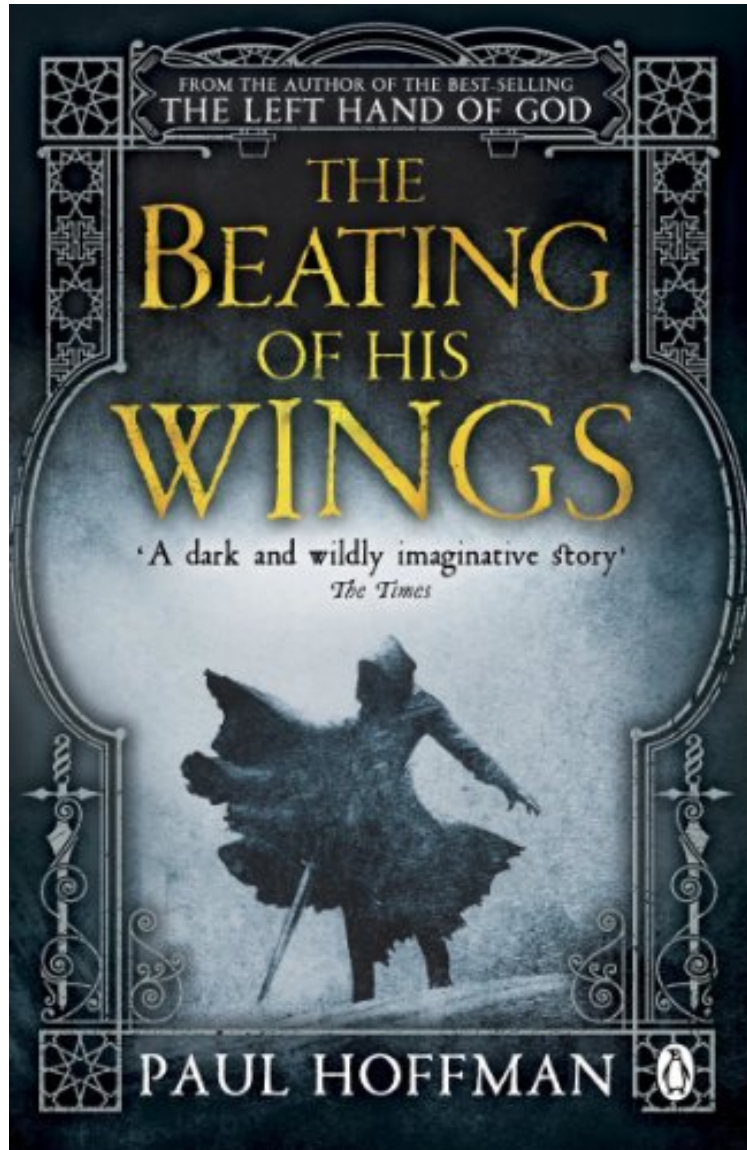

I found most of the main characters engaging and in one case at least developments teeter on the heartbreaking. The vividly portrayed violence is still there but it is interspersed by long interludes of character development away from the main narrative.
