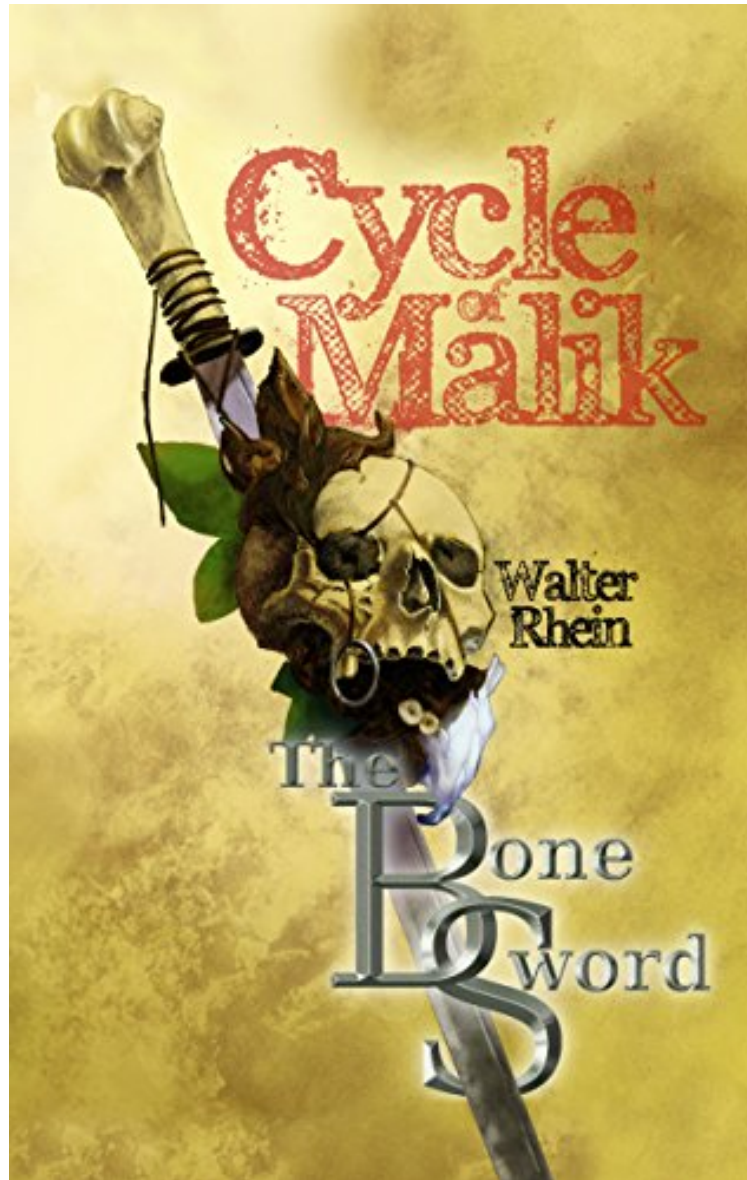

Walter' Rhein's "The Bone Sword (Cycle of Malik Book 1) is a stirring start to a new series. Rhein writes with passion and power, reaching for a reality he wants to share with us, and almost always succeeds. Even when he wobbles, his work is better than that of ninety-nine per cent of the new writers in heroic fantasy today. I'd much rather have a writer who loves language try for brilliance and once in a great while miss the target, line by line, or formula writers pecking out dross that never takes a breath. And Rhein's characters breathe. They're flawed. They're foolish, sometimes, and furious at other times. But they feel, and, even better, you feel what they feel.

The Bone Sword is steeped in adventures seen through the eyes of the warrior Malik and by a brother and sister fleeing evil. Evil, in Rhein's world, bars no holds. It's preeminent practitioner between these covers, Fathor Ivory, is a character you'll love to hate. The evil priest chases the brother and sister because the sister, Jasmine, has a real gift of healing -- something no religious pretender can equal.

Whoops.. I started telling you the story. I shouldn't do that, for the story is very inventive and lots of fun. If you are twelve or over, and don't mind a bit of gore with your heroics, a bit of ethics with your fantasy, a bit of lyricism with your prose, you'll want to read the Bone Sword. And look out for more for Mr. Rhein: he's a man with a talent for entertaining his readers, a skill that's nearly lost by others. I received a complementary copy of The Bone Sword in exchange for an honest review, and I'm so glad I did -- otherwise I would have missed this book and its engaging, powerful new writer, Walter Rhein.
