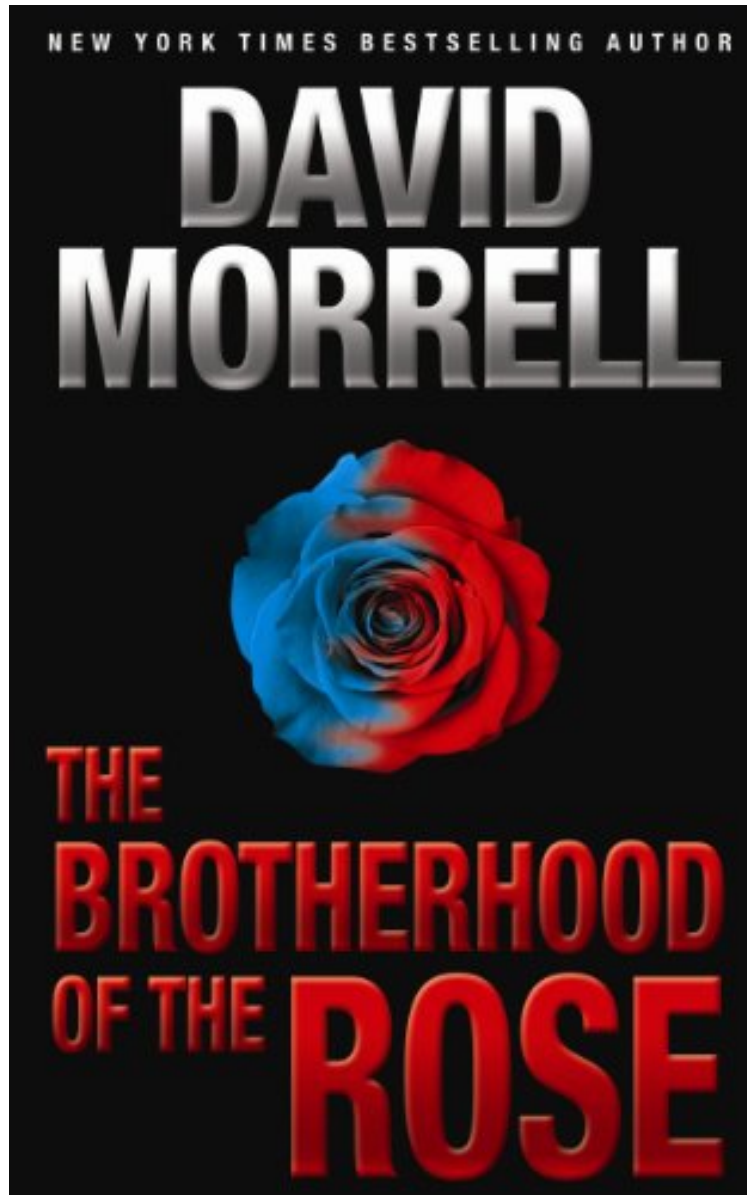

The pluses are that Morrell writes with an authentic eye to detail about spycraft and his characters are engrossing and lively. On the minus side, the book is too long (it flags at the end) and the ending does not satisfy. It implies that killing is the solution to one's problems, which I doubt is the case in real life. It's plot was complex, and I enjoyed the way he built the characters in the present, and showed how they got that way through the past. Flashbacks are usually boring to me, but Morrell did this first class. In a way this is the beginning of a trilogy of novels, all involving agents who are trying to get out but can't leave the game. The Fraternity of the Stone is next, here the agent is hunted and haunted by the vows he has taken. Finally The League of Night and Fog concludes the trilogy, where the characters of both novels come together. I recommend all three, as I do anything with Morrell as the author.
