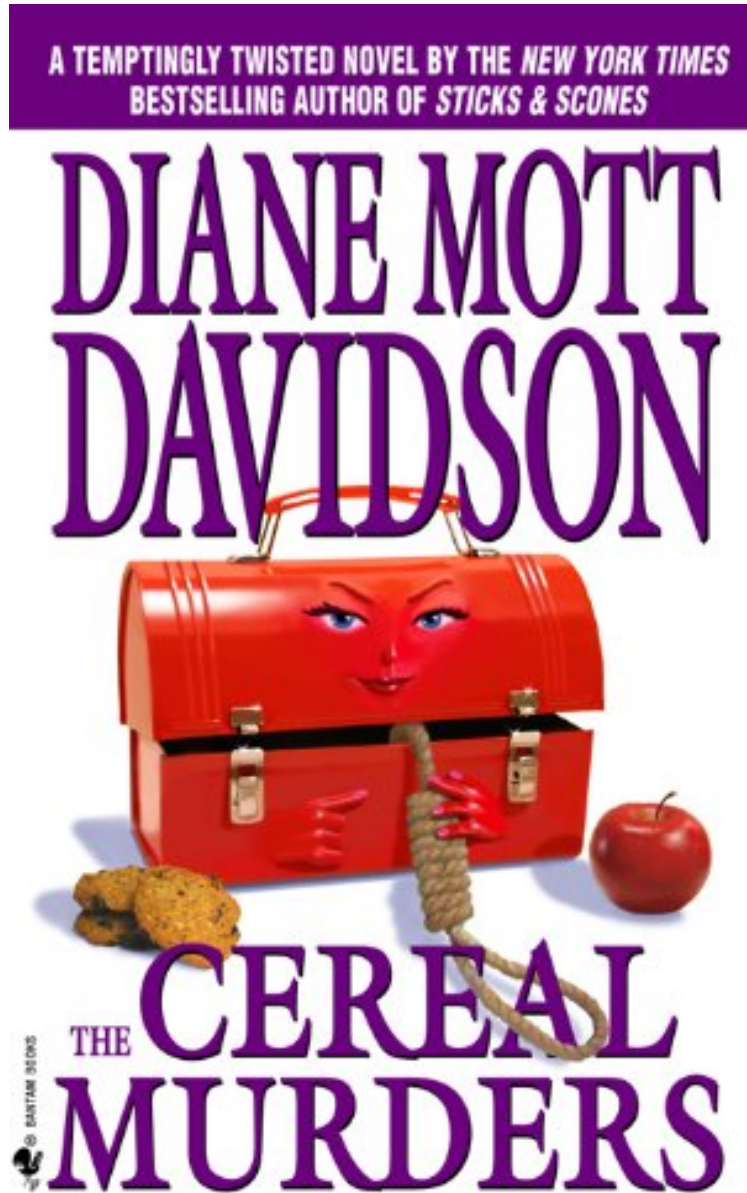

This one deals with the murder of the valedictorian of the prep school. Goldy discovers him when she is packing up the catering van after a college information night/event. The story focus is on the pressure of getting into the "right" college. The pressure is on the students, their parents and the administrators and teachers. The question is, who will sink to any level to achieve what they believe they deserve. While the storyline was a bit stark for me, the recipes were excellent. "The Cereal Murders" romps through the world of private education with witty insight. As seniors at Elk Park Preparatory gear up for college admission, they and their parents need more than guidance counseling when a star student turns up murdered after a school event catered by Goldy Bear (owner of Goldilocks' Catering, Where Everything Is Just Right). Goldy and her sometimes-boyfriend, Homicide Detective Tom Schulz, become embroiled in the case, discovering many clues and a few red herrings along the way. The recipes alone are worth reading--be careful not to drool on the page! Check out Diane Mott Davidson's other books as well--all are equally delicious! For other, non-culinary, humorous mysteries, try any of Dorothy Cannell's offerings. She is another author with a tongue-in-cheek, sometimes irreverent style of writing.

Kurzbeschreibung Thanks to her recent adventures in *Dying for Chocolate*, Goldy Bear, the premier caterer of Aspen Meadow, Colorado, is no stranger to violence--or sudden death. But when she agrees to cater the first College Advisory Dinner for Seniors and Parents at the exclusive Elk Park Preparatory School, the last thing she expects to find at the end of the evening is the battered body of the school valedictorian. Who could have killed Keith Andrews, and why? Goldy's hungry for some answers--and not just because she found the corpse. Her young son, Arch, a student at Elk Park Prep, has become a target for some not-so-funny pranks, while her eighteen-year-old live-in helper, Julian, has become a prime suspect in the Andrews boy's murder. As her investigation intensifies, Goldy's anxiety level rises faster than homemade doughnuts. . . as she turns up evidence that suggests that Keith knew more than enough to blow the lid off some very unscholarly secrets. From Kirkus s Denver caterer Goldy Bear (*Catering to Nobody*, 1990, etc.) is once again up to her oven-mitts in murder, this time when Elk Park Prep's valedictorian is found swinging from an extension cord after the College Advisory Dinner. In quick succession: Goldy's son Arch finds a rattlesnake strung up in his school locker; a poisonous spider nips Goldy; their front steps are vandalized (ditto the chimney); an anonymous caller zeroes in on them; and Elk Park's incorruptible French teacher is strangled. Furthermore, Julian, Goldy's boarder and Elk Park's salutatorian, is beginning to panic, while several other students and their overly competitive parents are angling for a better class ranking--and a better crack at the college of their choice. There'll be another murder, plus bookstore mayhem, before Goldy and her cop boyfriend Tom Schulz wrap things up and plot their own marriage. The Virginia Rich crowd will gobble it up, though they'll be asked to swallow a lot of romance, too. Not the best plotting, for sure, but the permanent cast--Goldy, Julian, Tom, and Goldy's ex-husband's other ex-wife--are extremely likable.
