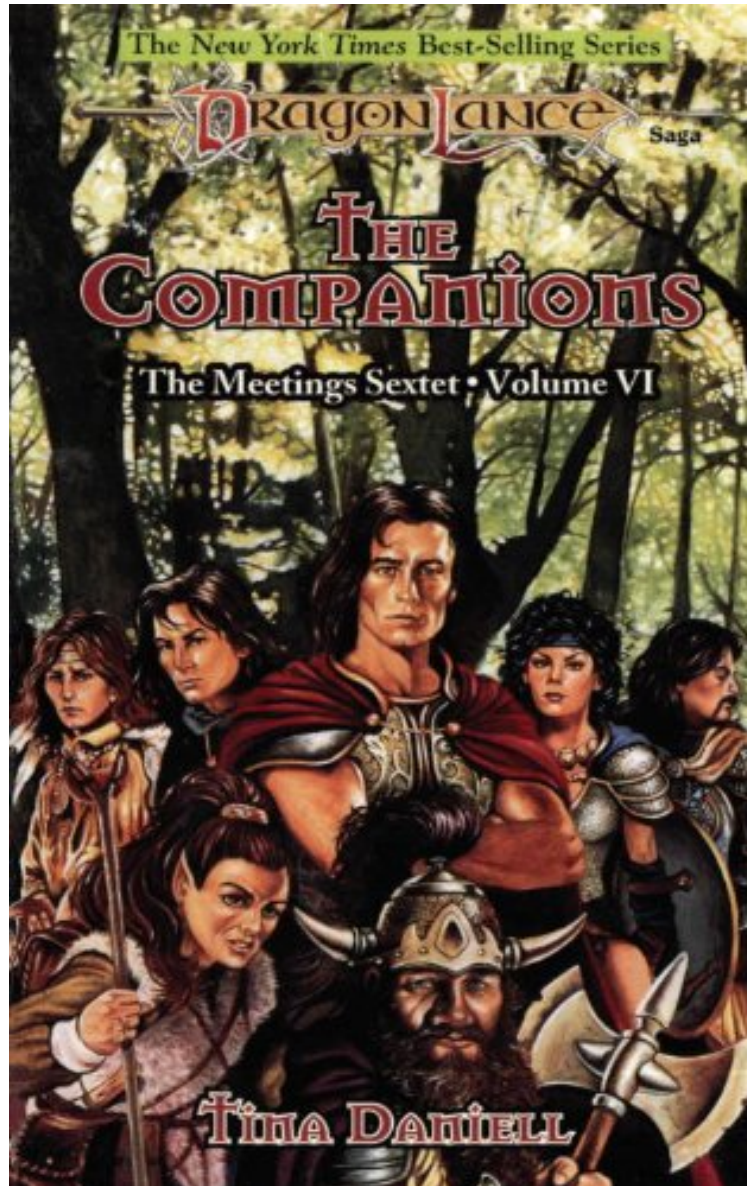

Tolpan, Sturm und Caramon unternehmen eine Reise, um für Raistlin seltene Zauberkomponenten bei einem Minotaurenhändler einzukaufen. Als das Trio jedoch von seiner Unternehmung nicht zurückkehrt, begeben sich ihre Freunde Tanis, Flint, Raistlin und sogar Kitiara auf die Suche nach ihnen. Schnell werden auch sie in die kriegerischen Pläne der Minotauren verwickelt, die den bösen Gott Sargonnas herbeirufen und mit seiner Hilfe ganz Ansalon unterjochen wollen. Auch der Abschluss des Bundes der Drachenlanze passt sich ganz dem eher flachen Niveau der Reihe an. Obwohl man die originale Gruppe (inklusive Kitiara) hier zum ersten Mal als Ganzes in Aktion erleben kann, ist die Geschichte nicht besonders spannend. Die Handlungen der bösen Minotauren scheinen keinen Sinn zu ergeben. So versucht der Nachtmeister, oberster Priester der Minotauren, Raistlin zum Ritual herbeizulocken, ohne dass jemals klar wird, weshalb er ihn für das zu vollziehende Ritual benötigt. Die Autorin deutet zudem Nebenhandlungen an, ohne sie im weiteren Verlauf zu einem logischen Schluss zu bringen. Als Beispiel sei hier die Verstrickung von Kitiaras Onkel in die Machenschaften der im Aufbau befindlichen Drachenarmeen genannt. Zu viele 'Deus ex Machina'-Effekte tun ein Übriges, um die ohnehin nicht spannende Geschichte noch mehr zu verwässern. Fazit: DL-Komplettisten bekommen hier durchschnittliches Lesefutter, alle anderen sollten sich besser nach anderen Büchern umsehen. 1 von 1 Kunden fanden die folgende Rezension hilfreich. What a waste. Von Ein Kunde This is not just the worst Dragonlance novel I have ever read, it is one of the worst books, period. I cannot believe TSR published this awful excuse for a novel. This must be Tina Daniell's first (and last, I hope) fantasy novel. I can imagine the preview if "The Companions" was a movie: "You'll howl with laughter as Tasslehoff takes an "evil" potion, and cuts off Sturm's moustache! Ha ha, ouch! Now, that's evil! You'll cringe as he paints his room black, proving his depravity! Watch out, folks! He means business!" But hey folks, if you can overlook plot chasms, awful syntax, and a boring and preposterous story that clearly never actually happened in the Dragonlance universe (one of the reasons we liked reading about Tanis and Raistlin and Sturm was that they were basically just ordinary people who became heroes through chance.
